# ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

## Academic Qualifications:

At least a high second division in the SSC and HSC examinations, or University of London GCE O-Level in five subjects and A-level in two major applicants without A-levels are generally required to complete six entry reduced to complete second to complete secon

- b) A US high school diploma or equivalent,

- c) A minimum Cumulative Grade point Average (CGPA) of 2.0, or equivalent results, for those who seek transfer from other institutions. Each case is considered on its own merit.
- Acceptable scores at EWU's admission test or a minimum score of 1100 in the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) together with a minimum score of 550 in TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language).

Pass course students or students with a two-year Bachelor's degree from recognized universities can apply for admission into a four-year undergraduate program. EWU will consider applications for credit transfer only in cases where previous academic work meets EWU degree requirements and the student has scored at least 50% marks in relevant courses.

Application forms are available on payment of Tk. 300 at EWU Office at 45, Mohakhali, Dhaka-1212. To receive application forms by mail, write to the office of the Registrar along with a bank draft or money order for Tk. 300 in favor of East West University and a self-addressed envelope.

## **ADMISSION TEST**

There is a two-hour admission test for students seeking admission into EWU. The dates are announced in major daily newspapers. Students are tested on English Language (Structure, Vocabulary, Comprehension and Composition), Basic Mathematics and General Knowledge. Those who want to study Computer Science are required to have competence in HSC-level Mathematics, while others are required to have reasonable proficiency in SSC-level Mathematics. Those who seek admission in BA (English) are exempted from the Math Test.

Results of admission tests are announced within 3 days of the tests. Successful applicants are duly informed of the results.

# REGISTRATION

Students are responsible for fulfilling all requirements of the degree program in which they are admitted. They should consult their advisors in planning their course schedule and be familiar with EWU policies and procedures related to registration and graduation requirements for their degrees. No registration is complete until all tuition fees are paid.

A student may not register after the first week of the semester except with special permission of the Academic Dean. To avoid late fees, students must register during scheduled registration periods.

# TUITION AND OTHER FEES

Fees, presented below, are lower than those of most of the major private universities of comparable quality in Bangladesh.

## **FINANCIAL AID**

Last West University firmly believes that nurturing talent is essential for an equitable and exploitation-free civil society in Bangladesh. The avowed policy of the University is to support meritorious students who need financial assistance. Any place-holder in the HSC examinations or anyone with equivalent results is entitled to a full-tuition scholarship for a thirty-credit academic year. From year 2 onwards, at least the top ten percent of full-time students are awarded full-tuition scholarships for the next 30-credit academic year. A number of other merit scholarships are also available for needy students. A full-time student for scholarship purposes is one who completes at least 30-credit hours in three consecutive semesters.

## SEMESTER STRUCTURE AND COURSE FORMAT

The academic year is divided into three semesters :

Spring Semester	:	February-May (Regular Semester)
Summer Semester	:	June-August (Lean Semester)
Fall Semester	:	September-December (Regular Semester)

For a 3-unit course, classes will meet either three times a week for 50-minute sessions, or two times a week for 80-minute sessions. If necessary, additional sessions, help sessions, make-up sessions, and workshops may be arranged by the teacher concerned.

Most of the courses carry 3 credit hours. A typical full-time student is expected to take 12 credit hours during Spring and Fall Semesters and complete the program in 4 years. Any student who desires to complete his/her degree earlier, would enroll for more courses during these two semesters and would also enroll during the optional Summer Semester.

## **GRADING SYSTEM**

There are five letter grades that a student may earn on the basis of his/her performance in a course. The letter A, B, C and D are considered passing grades. The grade 'F' is the failing grade. The numerical equivalent of the grades are given below :

A letter grade followed by a (+) will have its GP enhanced by 0.30 while one followed by a (-) will have 0.30 deducted from it. Thus, B+ earns 3.30, while B – earns 2.70.

For incomplete course work a student may receive the Incomplete Grade (I). In a minimum complete grade, students have to earn a passing grade in the course within a year. Withdrawal from a course may be allowed with the standing a student must maintain a minimum Cumulative Grade Point (COPA) of 2.00.
