Help build dignified nation, PM urges scientists

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday sought all-out cooperation of scientists, researchers and technologists of the country in building the nation as a dignified one in the world by utilising their innovative power, reports UNB.

Assuring all sorts of assistance and cooperation in this regard, she said that despite limited resources, her government would continue its support to scientific endeavors by researchers and scientists. The prime minister was distributing medals among scientists and fellows of Bangladesh Academy of Sciences in recognition of their contributions in respective fields at a ceremony held at Osmani Memorial Auditorium in the city.

Twenty-two scientists, both senior and young, working in different areas with different institutions of the country were honoured with gold medals of Bangladesh Academy of Sciences.

Putting emphasis on scientific research, Hasina said scientists and researchers will have to play effective role for the advancement of the country by utilising their creativity within the available limited resources.

She urged the new generation to be involved in researchoriented activities, saying they would be able to take the country towards prosperity and development. The prime minister said that her government is always sincere in patronizing scientific research and invention as well as in formulating science and research friendly policy.

In this regard, she mentioned the introduction of providing Bangabandhu Fellowship, ICT Fellowship and other assistances by the government for conducting research in various fields of science and technology during its 1996-2001 term, which aimed at building efficient and skilled scientists, researchers and technologists.

She alleged that the BNP-Jamat alliance government had deprived the scientists and researchers community in pursuing their innovative activities by stopping the initiatives of the Awami League government.

Hasina said scientists of the country invented drought-tolerant varieties of paddy by using bio-technology and genetic engineering.

The country has now become self-reliant in food production with coordinated efforts of all including the support of the government, sincerity of the scientists, and above all hard labour of farmers, she said.

Highlighting the success of the country's scientists and researchers, she mentioned that they decoded the genome sequence of jute brightening the country's image abroad.

Scientist of the country, through their publications in international science journals, have also brightened the country's image, Hasina said adding that they are taking the country to a new height in the world community by their works at home and abroad.

She stressed the need for more research endeavors to take the country forward and said that her government has created opportunities for research activities.

About the initiative of her government in establishing a 'Science Building', she said the ECNEC has already approved a proposal in this regard.
